With this kit you can collect and return the samples needed for your recommended tests.

The results of this STI test will show whether a bacteria or virus is present. It's not a clinical diagnosis of a condition and should not replace advice from your doctor. If you have any symptoms of an STI or concerns regarding your sexual health, you should speak with your GP or visit a local sexual health clinic.





Returning your samples

Once you're ready to return your samples, place them along with your completed form back into the kit box.

Close it securely by inserting the two large tabs on the box lid into the slots, pressing down firmly to lock them into place. Apply the clear security seal provided or add tape for extra security.

Return postage is not required, just pop the kit box into any Royal Mail post box. Find your nearest post box by scanning this QR code.



Collecting your blood sample



4 Use the alcohol wipe to clean one of your middle fingers, and let it dry.

to keep it steady.

- 5 Twist the tip of the safety lancet to break the seal, and remove the cap.
- Place the safety lancet on the finger, and push firmly to activate.
 The lancet activates once.



Helpful tips

To help blood flow, take a hot shower or bath just before you collect your sample.

Stay standing, with your hand below your waist and your arm straight.

The safety lancet isn't painful, but if you're nervous, you could ask someone to help.

Wipe away the first drop of blood with a clean, dry tissue.

Gently massage the finger from the base to the tip (using a milking motion) and allow drops to fall into the tube.

- Fill the tube to the upper line on the side (marked 600). We may not be able to test samples below the 400 line.
- If you are unable to collect enough blood, we've included spare needles, so try another finger (or two).
 - 1 Apply a plaster to your finger, then tightly press the cap onto the tube. **Please wipe any blood** from the outside of the tube.

2 Gently turn the collection tube upside down 5 times. Place it into the transport bag, fold the top of the bag over and seal it.



Collecting your rectal swab

What you will need

Rectal swab

- 1 Wash your hands and unpack the kit on a clean surface, ideally in a bathroom.
- 2 Firmly hold the swab **3-4cm** from the tip. **Avoid laying it down or touching its tip**.
- 3 Find a comfortable position and insert the swab 2–3cm into your rectum.



Helpful tip

Before you collect this sample, it helps to wipe your bottom with a tissue.

Gently **rotate the swab** 5–10 times in large circles against the inside of your rectum.



Gently rotate the swab whilst slowly removing it, and return to the tube pushing tightly to close the seal.
